

Mass Attendance Restrictions

We have received the following directive from Cardinal Collins of the Archdiocese of Toronto.

"I am directing parishes in York, Toronto and Peel Regions to implement the following measures:

As of Tuesday, November 24, 2020, parishes must restrict attendance at all liturgical celebrations (Mass, Weddings, Funerals and Baptisms) to **50 worshipers in the entire building**, excluding those who are involved in ministry (clergy, musicians, and all other liturgical ministers and volunteers)"

The Cardinal asks that we please continue to ensure strict adherence to sanitization, distancing and other measures as outlined in WorshipSafe Guidelines of the Archdiocese.

Parish halls <u>may not</u> be used to accommodate additional parishioners at the same time as a Mass in the church.

At this time, the Cardinal has not informed us when these restrictions will be lifted. Our Sunday 11:30 am mass will continue to be livestreamed. To view the livestream, please click on the appropriate post on our parish website homepage.
