7 - 2

Isaiah 60: 1-6 The glory of the Lord shines upon us.

### **2021 Offertory Parish Programs**

The pandemic shines a light on how we have done church and it challenges us to rethink how we carry our mission both now and in the future. But truly our mission must stay the same.

The mission of our parish community hasn't changed during the pandemic, but our methods for funding the mission must change. Parishioners are our parish's only source of revenue. Pre-pandemic, over 95% of our collection would be received by passing the basket during the offertory collection in the middle of Sunday mass. Obviously, this didn't work very well when the church was locked down from this past March to mid June or as is right now, or when we were only able to operate with reduced numbers from mid-June to November 23<sup>rd</sup>.

To ensure a consistent revenue stream so that we are able to continue to serve you as well maintain our parish church, we are asking that you consider switching to the online "Donate Now" system in which you use your credit card, or else to the Pre-Authorized Giving Program of in which a monthly amount determined by you is withdrawn on the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month. #### Why did Cardinal Collins cancel Masses in lockdown areas?

In response to this question frequently asked by many parishioners of the Archdiocese of Toronto, the following response was shared to parishes from the Office of Public Relations:

Places of worship in lockdown regions (the City of Toronto and Peel Region) are restricted to no more than 10 persons inside the building. On November 20, Cardinal Collins asked parishes that have the ability to do so, to be open for private prayer. Of course, even when there is no public Mass, priests continue to celebrate private Mass each day for the intentions of the faithful and for those suffering from Covid-19. In addition, close to one hundred parishes livestream Sunday services, some with daily Mass.

"I am deeply disappointed that, in some regions of the archdiocese, we must restrict participation in the sacraments. This will inflict a great spiritual pain upon those who safely and with great dedication have been drawing spiritual strength to sustain them, and to help them to serve those suffering in this pandemic."

Offerina public Masses when the civil authorities set a limit of only 10 people (in practice, 8 or 9 parishioners) creates numerous challenges to do so in a fair manner: many parishes in the affected regions have daily Mass attendance approaching 100 people or several hundred worshippers more. and attending Sunday Masses. The challenge in allowing only eight or nine people to attend Mass are significant, if we are to be fair to all. Who is permitted to attend? How does one deal with the 10<sup>th</sup> or 11th person wishing to attend? For nine or fewer people, online reservation systems are not practical nor equitable.
