

## PASSION/PALM SUNDAY

Isaiah 50:4-7 God's suffering servant brings us hope.

Philippians 2:6-11 A hymn to Jesus' humility and exaltation.

Mark 14:1-15:47 The suffering and death of Jesus.

Our Gospel this week focuses on the greatest gift we are given in Jesus: the gift of Himself in life and in death. Jesus surrendered Himself to be lifted up on the cross and then in resurrected glory so as to draw all unto Himself and to God. Through this salvific act, all sinners are saved. You and I are saved. # The Holy Triduum Holy Thursday Good Friday Easter Vigil

### Triduum – One Liturgy, One Focus

On these three days, we remember and ritually the Passion. commemorate Death. and Resurrection of Jesus Christ - the Paschal Mystery. This is a ONE three-day liturgy, ONE continuous celebration. We do not just commemorate Christ's agony in the garden on Holy Thursday or just the crucifixion on Good Friday. While there is certainly sorrow at the death of the Lord, we look to the end of the story. What we commemorate at each of the three celebrations over the whole three days is the cross of Jesus Christ and the life that comes from it through death.

In His Passion and death, Christ passed over into the eternal glory of God. He passed over into resurrected life. Christ's resurrected life is unlike anything we now know. It is, in fact, a new way of being – a new way of being alive – that, until Christ, was not known. Resurrected life is not the same, for example, as the life that Lazarus lived after he was raised to life by Jesus. Lazarus was resuscitated to the same kind of life he lived before Christ, on the other hand, in the he died. resurrected life, lives in a completely different way than before He was crucified. It is a life not bound by time, not bound by physical space, or even death. He has passed over death in this new life in glory.

This is the **life of eternity**: the life, which every one of us who has been baptized into the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ will hopefully one day share. This is the life that we will know completely when Christ returns in glory at the end of time.
